




WELCOME

Crissy Lauterbach is the Innovative Teaching and Learning Coordinator for Butler Tech in Hamilton, Ohio. In 1994, she earned a Bachelor of Science in Education at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. She completed her graduate work in Educational Leadership and Curriculum at the University of Dayton and earned a Masters in Administration. She is currently working on her doctorate at Miami University.

Being a 28-year veteran educator, Miss Lauterbach was the keynote speaker for the Department of Defense Schools' International Future Educators Association in Garmisch, Germany, Tedx Yearling, and the Anthony Munoz Foundation's Youth Summit. She was also the Teacher Ambassador at South Craven School in Yorkshire, England.. In 2014, she became the first National Advisor in Residence for Educators Rising.

In 2015, Crissy was named a White House Innovator for her work in Teacher's Academy and Educators Rising. Her awards include: Ohio Teacher of the Year Semifinalist, Leavey Award Winner, Tri-state Educator of the Year, the Wooster Excellence in Education Award, the ACTE Community Service Educator of the Year for Region 1, and the inaugural winner of the Erin Young Award for honoring student voice in her classroom. Thursday Feb. 23, 2023

"Becoming a Powerful Bilingual Teacher Advocate by Knowing our New Mexico Bilingual Multicultural Legacy" Presented by: Saasha Lambson & Erika Mata Audience: General Interest

Description: This session will focus on providing a history of bilingual education in New Mexico, initial policies and legislation, and the key Nuevomexicano and Latino leaders that laid the foundation for our current bilingual multicultural education programs.

ECECD Scholarship and Wage Incentive - Earn Your Early Childhood Degree for Free

Description: During this session, learn how you can attend college for free when you pursue a certificate or degree in Early Childhood Education. You will also learn how earning college credits can help supplement your income through the Wage Supplement Program. And finally, learn how you can receive a one-time incentive payment if you are a certified bilingual educator.

From Backpack to Briefcase: Navigating field experiences and teacher preparation and bridging the gap between theory and practice

Presented by: Dr. Matthew Vetterly Audience: EdRising High School/Collegiate Description: This workshop will provide hands-on learning for future educators by connecting classroom theory to practice. Participants will learn about expectations for field experiences in teacher preparation programs and hear from current teacher candidates about their experiences. The workshop will cover the importance of field experiences and the activities involved, including taking field notes and will discuss the structure of professional development schools. The session will also involve collaboration and reflection on participants' field experiences during Educators Rising. The workshop will conclude with a discussion on how these experiences have helped students reflect on the learning-teaching process through observation and classroom activities.

Studying Abroad!

Description: This safe zone presentation is designed to guide staff in creating safe and supportive environments for LGBTQ+ students, staff, and community. We will discuss ways to create environments that reduce bullying and encourage school performance. Data why this matters will be presented as well. Finally, we will discuss ways to intervene when anti-LGBTQ behaviors occur and practice scenarios.

This grant looks to take into account the cultural and linguistic identities of the students as a major component to creating bilingual chapters in New Mexico. The Taskforce shall produce four white papers that provide guidance on how to do that for Native and Bilingual students in New Mexico.
