

Dr. Pamela Remstein, PhD Early Childhood Education & Development Program Coordinator for Teacher Pathways

Dr. Pamela Remstein has worked in early childhood education for over 30 years and is the Assistant Professor of early childhood and Program Coordinator of Education at the University of New Mexico, Taos branch. As faculty she directs an innovative early childhood preparation program which focuses on teacher residency and student academic success through inquiry and emergent based-learning. Twenty-one years ago, she moved to Taos to enjoy the sanctity of the mountains. With much joy, Pam has been a Head Start teacher and education director, directed several non-profit and for-profit early learning centers in New Mexico and New York, mentored teachers in NM's Aim High Program, and has been an adjunct instructor.

Additionally, she is an active member of Taos' Paso a Paso Network, a group of early childhood professionals who work to improve the lives of young children and their families, Adobe Think Tank ECHO, which is designed to explore American Indian communities' visions for the care and education of young children, the Collaborative Teacher Institute, and the New Mexico Reggio Emilia Exchange, a group of dedicated early childhood educators committed to studying and sharing the principles of the Reggio Emilia approach of learning, that sees children as capable citizens with rights.
